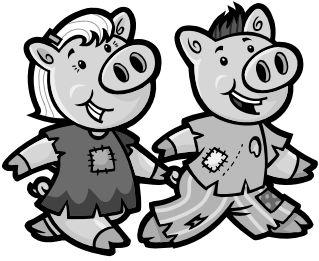




# ***From Rags to Riches™*** ***The Fun Idioms Game - 200 Illustrated Idiom Cards!***

### ***From Rags to Riches™* includes:**

- A Colorful, Sturdy 16" x 16" Game Board
- 200 Illustrated Idiom Playing Cards
- 96 Super Dollars™
- Die, Pawns, and Answer Sheet



### **Introduction:**

In *From Rags to Riches™*, students learn by answering the idioms on the idioms playing cards.

### **Object of the Game:**

Player collects Super Dollars™ every time he/she answers an idiom correctly. Player with the most money at the finish wins!

### **How to play:**

1. Shuffle and place the idiom playing cards face down.
2. Place 2 Super Dollars™ in Bonus Bucks space located in the middle of the board. Give each player 5 Super Dollars™.
3. Have each student choose a pawn to represent him/her in the game. Players roll the die. Highest number begins the game.
4. Each player places his/her token on the "Start" space.
5. First player rolls the die and moves the appropriate number of spaces.
6. Player picks up a card, read/says it aloud and chooses the correct answer. Adult may read card for non-readers. If player answers the idiom correctly, he/she receives a Super Dollar™.
7. Players take turns following instructions on spaces. Players move from outside spaces to inside spaces when they land on an arrow.
8. When player has to pay a Dollar, player places a Super Dollar™ on the Bonus Bucks space in the center of the board. When a player lands on a Bonus Bucks space, he/she collects all the Super Dollars™ in Bonus Bucks.

### ***From Rags to Riches™* Game Variations:**

- Play the game backwards.
- First player to reach the finish wins.
- If player doesn't know the correct answer, he/she may ask another player for the answer. If the answer is correct, both players receive a Super Dollar™. If the answer is incorrect, play continues in turn.
- If player doesn't know the answer, he/she may choose the next card. If he/she answers correctly he/she receives a Super Dollar™. If he/she answers incorrectly, he/she must place 2 Super Dollars™ on the Bonus Bucks space.
- Allow players to buy a prize from a Super Duper® Prize Bucket (not included).

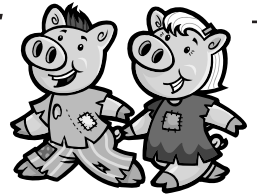
### **Using the cards alone:**
